US EQUESTRIAN FEDERATION

LIFE, SENIOR ACTIVE AND JUNIOR ACTIVE MEMBERS SHALL BE ELIGIBLE TO PARTICIPATE IN ALL CLASSES AT REGULAR COMPETITIONS, EVENTING COMPETITIONS AT THE PRELIMINARY LEVEL OR ABOVE AND COMBINED DRIVING COMPETITIONS AT THE ADVANCED LEVEL, DRESSAGE, REINING AND VAULTING COMPETITIONS AND ENDURANCE RIDES. A NON-MEMBER MAY PARTICIPATE AS A HANDLER, RIDER, DRIVER, OWNER, LESSEE, AGENT, COACH OR TRAINER AT REGULAR COMPETITIONS, EVENTING COMPETITIONS, DRESSAGE COMPETITIONS, REINING COMPETITIONS AND COMBINED DRIVING COMPETITIONS UPON PAYMENT OF A \$30 NON-MEMBER REGISTRATION FEE. PARTICIPANTS IN THE FOLLOWING CLASSES ARE EXEMPTED FROM THE REQUIREMENTS OF THIS RULE; 1) LEADLINE; 2) EXHIBITIONS; 3) GAMES AND RACES; 4) CLASSES FOR 4-H MEMBERS; 5) WALK TROT AND ACADEMY CLASSES (Academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF INTRODUCTORY LEVEL TESTS, PAS DE DEUX AND QUADRILLE CLASSES, 7) NRHA ENDORSED REINING COMPETITIONS; 8) OPPORTUNITY CLASSES; 9) CITIZENS OF OTHER NATIONS WHO HAVE PROOF, IN ENGLISH, OF CURRENT MEMBERSHIP IN GOOD STANDING OF THEIR OWN NATIONAL FEDERATION, 10) USEA BEGINNER NOVICE DIVISION; AND 11) ASSISTANT HANDLERS IN DRESSAGE SPORT HORSE BREEDING CLASSES.

EVERY CLASS OFFERED HEREIN WHICH IS COVERED BY THE RULES AND SPECIFICATIONS OF THE CURRENT FEDERATION RULE BOOK WILL BE CONDUCTED AND JUDGED IN ACCORDANCE THEREWITH.

Great American Insurance Group/USDF QUALIFYING CLASSES

Indicate that a class is to be a qualifying test by adding a Q after the class number and a \$10 USDF fee on the entry. Qualifying classes run concurrently with the highest test of each level, no separate ride required. Qualifying classes are not pinned. Riders must specify their division (**Open, AA, J/Y**).

OPPORTUNITY CLASSES

These classes do not require memberships or Federation fees. Cross entering into other classes is allowed but will require payment of all applicable fees.

ENTRIES

Only one horse per entry blank per show. Entries must be received by the closing date. Entries must include payment in full to "Horse Sports by the Bay". Each competitor is responsible for supplying management with a valid Coggins and correct association numbers (USDF/USEF) for horse, owner, rider/handler, and trainer. The scores of competitors who fail to supply correct numbers may not be counted toward national awards. Registry papers must be provided for horses entering IBC classes. Entries accepted on a first come, first served basis until shows are filled after which a waiting list will be established. Entries received after the closing date pay a \$50 late entry fee if accepted. A \$100 processing fee plus collection fees will be charged for non-negotiable checks.

OFFICE FEES

A fee of \$25 per show for DBB I and DBB II will be charged to each entry for office, medical personnel, and schooling. A change of rider/horse/handler will result in a \$25 change fee after closing; all other changes to entries after closing will be \$10/change.

REFUNDS

Cancellations prior to or on closing date receive full refund less office fee. No refund of any fees for any reason after the closing date. Should Management have to cancel classes/divisions that can not be rescheduled due to inclement weather and/or any other emergency there is no refund on any fees.

NO SHOWS

All "no shows" that have not contacted the show office will be considered a scratch for the rest of the show and ride times may be filled from waiting list.

AWARDS FOR OPEN SHOWS

Divisions (Open, AA, J/Y) may run concurrently as one class but all will be pinned separately. Rider must clearly specify the division to be entered or will be entered as open by default. Ribbon and prize awarded to first place. Ribbons awarded to sixth place. Championship and Reserve awarded to Open, AA, & J/Y high scores at each level, Introductory through Fourth and FEI. Horse/rider combinations must have competed in at least two classes of the same level to be eligible. Freestyle scores do not count toward championships. All ribbons and awards must be picked up by the end of the show.

FREESTYLE

CD's must be clearly labeled with entry name, number, and music directives and delivered to show office 24 hours prior to ride for sound check. A copy of minimum 60% qualifying test to verify eligibility must be included with entry.

NON-SHOWING HORSES

There will be a \$50 fee/show for each non-showing horse. Horses must be registered on an entry form with show secretary and stabling manager.

STABLING

Stalls are \$150 and are available Wednesday at 12noon through Sunday at 5PM. For DBB II, Limited "Breed Show Only" stalls are \$50 and are available Saturday at 12noon through Sunday at 5PM. Stalls are 10 x 10 temporary under canvas with doors. No initial bedding provided. ALL STALL RESERVATIONS ARE NON REFUNDABLE AFTER CLOSING DATE. No smoking and No Parking in the barn area. Stalls assignments will be posted at the Stable Office – competitors found using incorrect stalls will be fined \$50.00.

ADDITIONAL EARLY ARRIVAL STABLING

Early arrivals are only accepted if authorized by Management. Early arrival stalls available at 12noon the day prior to scheduled stabling and are \$50/stall.

ARENAS

All outdoor arenas and warm ups are sand/limestone Mix. All dressage arenas are 20m x 60 m. Please see www.horseshowsbythebay.com for facility map & show grounds photos.

PADDOCKS

A limited number of paddocks will be available to rent for a weekly fee of \$250. All Paddocks are reserved on a first come first served basis. Payment in full by close of entries is required for reservation to be considered valid.

FEED/BEDDING

All bedding prepaid on entries will be delivered to stabling prior to show. On grounds feed and bedding orders will need to be placed and paid for with the Stable/Feed Office by 12 noon each day, up until noon Saturday. Pre-paid orders cancelled after delivery will be subject to a 50% re-stocking fee.

GROUNDS FEE

A \$25/day fee will be charged for all entries showing out of a trailer, including on days of schooling. A Designated Area will be assigned for all ship-ins.

MANAGEMENT

Management reserves the right to combine, split, cancel, or change the classes based on subscription. Management reserves the right to refuse, accept conditionally and to cancel any entry, disqualify exhibitor(s), prohibit exhibition of entries and cancel awards of prizes without claims for damages. Neither HORSE SPORTS BY THE BAY, Inc, nor Dean Rheinheimer, nor Alexandra Rheinheimer, nor FLINTFIELDS HORSE PARK/BATES HORSE PARK, LLC will be responsible in any way for loss or damage, to any persons, animals, or property or equipment that may be caused by any horse or pony entered by Exhibitor or due to the carelessness or negligence of the person or persons in charge of such horse or pony or their subordinates. This shall be condition of entry to the show and show grounds.

SCHOOLING

All horses on the grounds must have an entry form, complete with all signatures and a valid Coggins, on file in the office prior to schooling, including non-showing horses. Schooling is permitted in the show rings until 6pm Wednesday, weather and conditions permitting. Schooling rings will be open daily from 6am – 9pm, weather and conditions permitting. An EMT will be on grounds on Wednesday. Horses must wear their show numbers. All other schooling sessions will be added at the discretion of Show Management. Longing is available in the posted arena only. No Longing in the Round Pens, active Schooling Rings or in the Show Arenas at all times.

RIDE TIMES

Tentative ride times will be emailed to riders approximately ten days prior to competition and posted on our website, www.horseshowsbythebay.com. All horses must wear numbers when ridden or exercised. Tentative times are subject to change. Official times must be confirmed at the show office.

CONCESSIONS

Food and vendors will be available on grounds during show days.

CANADIAN EXHIBITORS

An additional \$35 fee will be charged for all checks drawn from a non-US bank.

LEASH LAW

All dogs must be on a leash at all times or owners will be subject to fine.

HEALTH REQUIREMENTS

Michigan law requires a negative EIA test that has been drawn within the calendar year or past 30 days for all horses being transported into the state. Current and valid Coggins must be presented to Show Secretary with entries to complete entry. Numbers will not be issued without verification.

MEDICAL WASTE

Due to Federal Regulations, all medical waste must be separated. Receptacles are provided by HORSE SHOWS BY THE BAY for disposal of hypodermic needles in all aisles. Failure to use them will result in a \$100 fine. Please do not mix with manure waste or trash cans.

PARKING

Horse Trailers and Cars will be asked to park in designated areas only. Parking in the Barn Area is STRICTLY PROHIBITED.

GOLF CARTS

A Full Service Golf Cart Company will be on show grounds for golf cart rental. Early reservations accepted by calling: 800-714-2210.

MOTORIZED VEHICLES

GR 301.5: Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles on competition grounds. Minors with valid temporary licenses may operate vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid license. Violations of this rule will be cause for sanctions against the parent(s), guardian(s) and/or trainer(s) who are responsible for the child committing the offense. Penalties may include exclusion of the child, parent(s), guardian(s), and/or trainer(s) from the competition grounds for the remainder of the competition and charges being filed against any of the above individuals in accordance with Rule 6. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

FARRIER & ALL OTHER SERVICE PERSONNEL

All Service orientated personnel including Farriers, Braiders, Veterinarians, Massage Therapists, Photographers, etc., other than OFFICIAL contracted providers MUST check in at the STABLE office to obtain permission to the show grounds and to receive a parking pass. Any persons found without credentials will be considered trespassing and asked to leave.

I-75 towards Grayling; @ Grayling follow M-72 West through Kalkaska; @ Williamsburg continue 1.9 miles to Bates Road; after Rail Crossing turn right onto Bates Road; Show Facility on Left 1/2 mile.

From Mid Michigan (Lansing Area)

Follow US-127 north to Clare; Merge onto M-10 West/M-115 West towards Ludington/Cadillac to Route 115 North; Merge onto M-131 North; Turn left onto Fife Lake Road/CR-605; Follow jog left staying on CR-605 to Williamsburg; Turn left on M-72 West; @ Williamsburg continue west 1.9 miles to Bates Road; after Rail Road Crossing turn right onto Bates Road; Facility on Left 1 mile.

From South West Michigan (Grand Rapids Area)

East I-96 north to Grand Rapids; take US 131 north to Cadillac; Turn left onto Fife Lake Road/CR-605; Follow jog left staying on CR-605 to Williamsburg; Turn left on M-72 West; @ Williamsburg continue 1.9 miles to Bates Road; after Rail Road Crossing turn right onto Bates Road.

From Northern Michigan (Petoskey Area)

US 31 South to Acme; East on M-72 3 miles; just prior to Railroad Tracks, turn left on Bates Road; Show Facility on Left 1 mile.

USDF Statement on Animal Welfare

The United States Dressage Federation, Inc. (USDF), a federation of over 125 independent organizations throughout the United States with a membership in excess of 33,000 members, supports the concept of ethical treatment of animals.

Dressage is a classical method of training horses, based upon the horse's natural responses, as carried out in a gradual, planned program during which the horse's athletic abilities are improved in a systematic manner. As a result, the horse becomes capable, comfortable, and responsive in partnership with the rider without the use of force. Dressage competition at various levels of achievement is the ultimate test of the training program to determine whether the desired harmony between horse and rider has been achieved.

The rules pertaining to dressage competition prohibit the use of artificial appliances, training aids, and drugs, which would force the horse to submit. Instead, the emphasis is upon training and a cooperative partnership with the rider. Major competitions are carefully monitored to assure that there is no unnecessary force or harshness displayed.

Unlike other horse sports in which horses enter training at a relatively immature state, dressage training is usually not seriously begun until the horse is three or four. The top levels of achievement require five or more years of progressive training and it is not unusual to see horses in international competition in their late teens. This, in itself, places a premium on good care and soundness throughout the horse's life.

While supporting the concept of animal welfare in its broadest form, the United States Dressage Federation, Inc., also recognizes that it is unrealistic to ascribe human emotions and responses to the horse which in its wild state is a creature of flight, living a hard and precarious existence. Under domestication, the horse is assured of ample food, water, and shelter, as well as protection against infectious diseases and damaging parasites, thus leading a longer and healthier life with a high rate of survival.

As an educational organization, USDF has numerous programs, which teach people how to pursue the accepted, humane training methods. A program of certifying instructors also emphasizes protecting the horse's welfare in pursuit of dressage training.
