HUNTER COURSES: Courses will simulate fences found in the hunting field such as brush, wall, in & out, oxer, post & rails, aiken, and panels. In some classes, a mandatory line may restrict the area of the courtesy circle. This line will be indicated on the course diagram and physically in the ring by use of bushes, wood markers, or cones.

PRIZE MONEY: Per HU112.3 – Prize money for all prize money classes will be distributed 30%, 22%, 15%, 13%, 10%, 10%. Ribbons 1 – 8 in all “A” & “C” rated sections. Ribbons 1 – 6 in all non-rated sections.

GENERAL RULES & REGULATIONS

EVERY CLASS OFFERED HEREIN WHICH IS COVERED BY THE RULES AND SPECIFICATIONS OF THE CURRENT US EQUESTRIAN RULE BOOK WILL BE CONDUCTED AND JUDGED IN ACCORDANCE THEREWITH.

Stabling: Stall requests will be accepted between April 1st and June 1st on a first come first serve basis. *In order to secure stabling payment in full is required at the time of reservation.* Two types of stalls are available: Frame Tent Stalls (stalls housed under Clear Span Frame Tents) @ \$250/stall and Pole Tent Stalls (stalls housed under traditional canvas pole tents) @ \$200/stall. A circuit/three week package is available at the following prices: Frame - \$675; Pole - \$525. These stalls must be ordered and paid for by the closing date to receive the package price. A grand total of 1092 stalls will be erected. Once the supply of stalls is exhausted a waiting list will be established and accepted based on length of stay and number of stalls being requested. Requests that are accepted after the closing date are subject to a late penalty of \$50/stall/week. Tack stalls will be limited to one stall per every three horses. Management reserves the right to limit "double stalls". Blank checks will be cashed upon acceptance for the total amount due. Please use the enclosed Stabling Form when ordering stalls. Stalls will be available by 12 noon, Sunday, July 5th. Stall location is assigned @ the sole discretion of show management.

Early Arrival: Early arrivals are only accepted if authorized by Management. Stalls will be available by 9am, Saturday, July 4 @ an additional fee of \$50/stall. Reservations must be made through Management.

Entries: Entries will be accepted between April 1st and June 1st and honored on a first come first serve basis. Entries are to be properly filled out including all necessary information required by USEF and show management. All entry forms require a blank check to cover added show fees. Should space allow, entries received after the closing date but prior to July 4th will be accepted with a late fee of \$25.00; All other late entries will be accepted up until 5pm the day prior to showing (if space allows) with the added penalty of \$50/entry/show. Any participant found showing in classes not entered may be subject to paying double the entry fee required.

Payments/Bill Disputes: All entries must be closed out on by the Sunday of each show week unless otherwise arranged with the official Show Secretary. Only bills settled up prior to the close of business on Sunday are eligible for review. Once the show week has ended all bills are final. Tack Stall, Feed, Shavings, and Hay splits must be done by Friday of each show week. A processing fee of \$100 plus bank collection fees will be assessed for non-negotiable checks.

Substitutions: Owners wishing to make a horse substitution after the closing date may do so with a fee of \$25 per show; scratch fees are waived.

Credentials: All USEF/USHJA membership numbers that apply must be on the entry form or a \$30 non-refundable non-member fee will be charged to each party in violation. All exhibitors in the Junior Hunter and classes restricted to ponies must have a valid measurement card prior to entry being accepted in those classes; Amateurs must present their Amateur certification before numbers can be issued.

Prize Money: Per GR 1210.6: If required by management, premiums of the competition will be paid to all competitors that have provided Social Security numbers, Federal ID numbers or Tax Identification numbers to the competition secretary. It is the sole responsibility of the competitor to provide the competition secretary with accurate payee information, including Social Security number, Federal ID number, or Tax Identification number, payee name and address. The above mentioned premiums must be paid within 30 days of the last day of the competition.

Refunds: Prior to the closing date, payments will be refunded in full upon written request. After the closing date stall fees are non-refundable. After the closing date but prior to 48 hours to the start of the show in question, nomination and entry fees will be refunded, less a \$25 office scratch fee/entry. Once the 48 hour period has been reached nomination and entry fees will be refunded less a \$50 office scratch fee/entry only upon the receipt of a signed Veterinarian's/Doctor Certificate. Once the show has commenced, horses not shown in any & all classes entered forfeit their entry fees unless a receipt from the official Show Veterinarian is received, less a \$150 scratch fee/entry. Should management have to cancel classes/divisions that cannot be rescheduled due to inclement weather and/or any other emergency situation there are no refunds on entry fees.

Administration Fee: A fee of \$55/entry/week will be charged for night watch, show arena schooling, security, and ShowNet.

Non-Showing Horses: A fee of \$150/entry/show will be charged for each non-showing horse; horses must be registered on an entry form with the official show secretary and recorded with the Stabling Manager.

Grounds Fee: A fee of \$25/day will be assessed for all entries showing out of a trailer, including warm up days. Trailers are to register with security upon arrival.

Parking Passes: Every vehicle & trailer that enters the show grounds will be required to display an official Horse Shows by the Bay Parking Pass. Passes will be provided at the Front Gate upon arrival by Show Security. Vehicles that are in violation will be required to pay the per person spectator fee. Parking is only allowed in the designated areas – all illegally parked cars will be towed at owner's expense.

Health Requirements: Michigan Law requires that a negative EIA test be drawn December 1st or later for all horses; all out of state horses must also possess a health certificate dated 30 days or less. Current paperwork must be presented to the official show secretary in order for entry to be considered complete. Numbers will not be issued without verification. Horse Name substitutions will not be allowed nor accepted, your horses show name must be on the paperwork.

Paddocks: A limited number of paddocks will be available to rent for a weekly fee of \$350. All paddocks are assigned on a first come, first served basis and are ONLY accepted upon complete payment. A limit of two paddocks per trainer may be implemented should supply be exhausted.

Motorized Vehicles: Per GR 1301.7 – Minors who do not have a valid driver’s license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles on completion grounds. Minors with a valid temporary license may operate vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid license. Violations of this rule will be cause for sanctions against the parent(s), guardian(s), and/or trainer(s) who are responsible for the child committing the offense. Penalties may include exclusion of the child, parent(s), guardian(s), and/or trainer(s) from the competition grounds for the remainder of the competition for the remainder of the competition and charges being filed against any of the above individuals in accordance to Chapter 6. Wheelchair and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

Leash Law: All dogs must be on a leash when on show grounds. Any owner whose dog interrupts a competitor’s round will be subject to the payment of the class interrupted plus may be subject to additional penalties, per GR 1301.6.

Schooling: All horses on the grounds must have an entry form, complete with all required signatures, an open check, and valid Coggins on file in the show office prior to schooling, including non-showing horses. Schooling will be allowed in each show ring, except the Grand Prix Ring, on the Tuesday prior to each show week from 9am – 5pm, weather permitting. An EMT will be on grounds. Riders must wear a current ASTM/SEI approved head gear while riding in the show ring. Schooling is limited to flatting only on the mornings of competition. All other schooling sessions will be added at the discretion of show management. Any horse and/or rider found schooling in a show ring that is closed will be subject to being excluded from showing for 24 hours upon incident & fined \$500.

Poling: *Manual poling and use of bamboo offsets are prohibited at all times while on show grounds.* Exhibitors found in violation will forfeit all entry fees for that showing day or day afterwards and may be excluded from showing for 24 hours upon any incident recorded with Management and the USEF Steward.

Medical Waste: Due to Federal Regulations, all medical waste must be separated. Receptacles (sharps containers) are provided for hypodermic needle waste. Failure to use them will result in a \$100 fine per needle found. PLEASE DO NOT MIX NEEDLES WITH THE MANURE OR TRASH!

Feed/Bedding: A feed, hay, and bedding service will be provided on-site. Please use the enclosed form for all pre-orders. Splits must be done with the show secretary by 12 noon Friday of each show week. Any orders that are delivered and then returned will be assessed a 50% re-stocking fee. The Stabling Manager has final word on all counts.

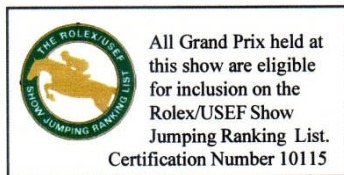
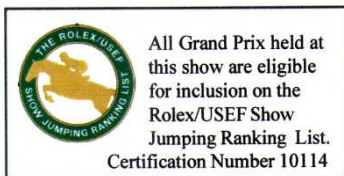
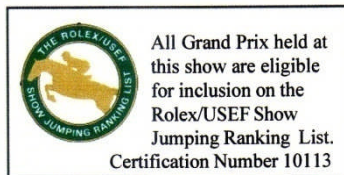
Helmets: Per GR 801 – It is compulsory for riders in all Hunter, Jumper and Hunt Seat Equitation classes where jumping is required, when jumping anywhere on the competition grounds, and when riding in the show rings to wear a properly fastened protective headgear which meets or exceeds ASTM/SEI standards for equestrian use and carries the SEI tag. Helmets must be properly fitted with harness secured. Any rider violating this rule at any time must immediately be prohibited from further riding until such headgear is properly in place.

Starting Order: A rotating jump order will be established and posted for all jumping classes, classics, and equitation medals and any other classes that may have priority. All horses must be ridden in the posted order. Riders and trainers that have conflicts must see the corresponding paddock master so that necessary adjustments to the order can be made. No ring will be held up for more than three minutes. All starting orders are drawn after the close of business the day prior to the classes showing or at the USEF Steward's discretion. All accepted post entries/adds will show at the top of the starting order. All add slips must be presented to the paddock master prior to the start of the class in question.

Back Numbers: A signature is required on each entry blank for each rider that rides that horse. Anyone found riding an entry while displaying a back number assigned to others without first having the new rider's signature attached to that entry will be considered in noncompliance. This signature is the sole responsibility of the rider. Riders found not in good standing will be subject to the penalty of the Federation as stated in GR908.3 and may be subject to disqualification and/or expulsion.

Championship & Reserve: Hunters & Equitation: Champion and Reserve Champion title will be awarded to two of the four horses acquiring the most points over fences in each applicable section. In addition to these points, only these four horses will receive full points for under saddle classes. Points to determine awards are as follows: 10,6,4,2,1,1/2. Model points are to count ½. Jumpers: Champion and Reserve Champion title will be awarded to the two horses which have acquired the most points in each Jumper section that offers 3 or more classes/section. In the event of a tie, the award will be made jointly. Prize Money awarded in each jumper section will count towards their respective USEF Horse of the Year Awards. Points to determine awards are as follows: 10,6,4,2,1,1/2.

Management: Management reserves the right to refuse, accept conditionally, and to cancel any entry, disqualify exhibitor(s), prohibit exhibition of entries and cancel awards of prizes without claims for damages. Divisions may combine or cancel if insufficient entries warrant; Management reserves the right to amend the Tentative Time Schedule as it deems necessary. Neither Horse Sports by the Bay, Inc nor Dean Rheinheimer, nor Alexandra Rheinheimer, nor Flintfields Horse Park, Bates Horse Park, LLC, nor Karin Flint will be responsible in any way for loss or damage, to any persons, animals, or property or equipment that may be caused by any horse or pony entered by Exhibitor or due to the carelessness or negligence of the person or persons in charge of such horse or pony or their subordinates. This shall be the condition of entry to the show and show grounds.

From Mid-Michigan (Lansing Area): Follow US-127 north to Clare; merge onto M-10 West/M-115 to Ludington/Cadillac to Route M-115 North; From M-115 merge onto M-131 North to Fife Lake Road; turn left onto Fife Lake Road/CR 605; Follow jog, staying left on CR-605 to Williamsburg; @ Williamsburg turn left on M-72, West; continue west 1.9 miles to Bates Road; after Rail Road Crossing turn right onto Bates Road; show facility on left ½ mile. 3 hours from Lansing

From South West Michigan (Grand Rapids Area): East 1-96 north to Grand Rapids to US 131 through Cadillac; continue north to Fife Lake Road; turn left onto Fife Lake Road/CR 605; Follow jog, staying left on CR-605 to Williamsburg; @ Williamsburg turn left on M-72, West; continue west 1.9 miles to Bates Road; after Rail Road Crossing turn right onto Bates Road; show facility on left ½ mile. 2 1/2 hours from Grand Rapids

From Northern Michigan (Petoskey Area): Follow US 31 South to Acme; @ Acme turn left (East) on M-72 towards Williamsburg; after 3 miles turn left onto Bates Road; show facility ½ mile on left. ALT Route: Follow US 31 South to Lochenheath (north Acme); turn left (east) onto Brackett Road; after 3 miles, @ stop sign, turn right onto Bates Road; show facility ¼ mile on right. 1 hour from Petoskey

From Traverse City: Follow US 31 North to Acme; @ Acme turn right (East) on M-72 towards Williamsburg; after 3 miles turn left onto Bates Road; show facility ½ mile on left. ALT Route: Follow US 31 South to Lochenheath (north Acme); turn right (east) onto Brackett Road; after 3 miles, @ stop sign, turn right onto Bates Road; show facility ¼ mile on right. 15 minutes from downtown.

From Toledo, Ohio & Lexington, KY: Follow US 75 north to Toledo; @ Toledo take US 23 north towards Ann Arbor; continue north on US 23, crossing over I-94 & I-96, staying north to Bay City/Flint; @ Bay City merge onto I-75 North towards Grayling; @ Grayling exit left onto M-72 West through Kalkaska to Williamsburg; @ Williamsburg continue west 1.9 miles to Bates Road; after Rail Road Crossing turn right onto Bates Road; show facility on left ½ mile. 5 hours from Toledo; 9 hours from Lexington

2010 ZONE V SPECIFICATIONS

ADULT HUNTER

To be ridden by Amateurs who are no longer eligible to compete as Junior Exhibitors. Riders may not compete in any other classes @ the same show where fences exceed 3'3" except the Adult Amateur Jumper Division & A/O Hunter. Any rider showing in the A/O Hunter Division may compete 1 different horse in the A/A Hunter Division and must own or have an USEF registered lease on said horse. Fences 2'9" to 3'; spreads not to exceed fence height. Ponies may be shown by Adults, suitability to count. Entries need not to be jogged for soundness. An unrestricted Children's/Adult division may be offered and be open to all Amateurs and Juniors with fences not to exceed 3'3".

CHILDREN'S HUNTER

Open to horses and ponies. To be ridden by a Junior Exhibitor. Neither horses nor riders may cross enter into the Junior Hunter section at the same show. Riders may cross enter into any classes in which fences exceed 3'3" at the same show, except Medal classes, age group equitation classes and Children's Jumper classes. Ponies may not compete in the Children's section if also entered in the pony division at the same show. Fence heights 2'9" to 3'; spreads not to exceed fence heights. Entries need not be jogged for soundness. An Unrestricted Children's/Adult Hunter division may be offered and be open to all Amateurs and Juniors with fences not to exceed 3'3".

CHILDREN'S HUNTER PONY (currently under revision – please see USHJA.org for current specs)

Open to ponies ridden by a Junior Exhibitor. Riders may not cross enter into any classes in which fences exceed 3'3" at the same show, except Medal classes, age group equitation classes and Children's Jumper classes. Ponies may not compete in the Children's section if also entered in the pony division at the same show. The combination pony/rider is not eligible for USEF rated classes at the same show. To be judged on performance, soundness, manners, way of going, and suitability as a Children's Hunter Pony. To be offered at two heights; fences 2' for sm & med; 2'6" for lg ponies; spreads not to exceed height of fence. Ponies need not to be jogged for soundness. No in & outs. Zone award will be presented annually as two sections – small/medium and large.

CHILDREN'S JUMPER

Open to horses and ponies. To be ridden by a Junior exhibitor. Horse/rider combinations may not cross enter into the Junior Jumper section at the same show. Riders may cross enter into Low Junior Jumper section if offered on a different horse at the same show. Riders may not compete above 1.30m (4'3") in any open class at the same show. Sections may be divided by age of rider or by horse/pony and may also be combined with the Adult Amateur Jumper section, if so stated in the prize list. Fences to be set at 3'6" or 1.10m; however shows may offer one class at 3'9" or 1.15m.

ADULT AMATEUR JUMPER

Open to horses and ponies to be ridden by exhibitors who are no longer eligible to compete as Junior Exhibitors. All exhibitors must be Amateurs in accordance with GR 1306 and must show USEF Amateur certification. Horse/rider combinations may not cross enter into any Amateur Owner Jumper section at the same show. Riders may cross enter into the Low Amateur Owner Jumper section if offered on a different horse at the same show. Riders may not compete above 1.30m (4'3") in any open class at the same show. Sections may be divided by age of rider or by horse/pony and may be combined with the Children's Jumper section, if so stated in the prize list. Fences to be set at 3'6" or 1.10m; however shows may offer one class at 3'9" or 1.15m.

PRE-GREEN HUNTER

A Pre-Green Hunter is a horse of any age in its first or second year of showing over 3' to 3'3" fences at USEF Regular Member or Canadian Equestrian Federation or any national or international competitions. Fences not to exceed 3'3". A 3' section must be offered and a 3'3" section may be offered. Horses may only compete in one height section at a show, but may alternate from one show to another. Once a horse has shown 3'6" he is not eligible to compete in the Pre-Greens, regardless of age. Exception: Green reinstatement. Pre-Green may not be reinstated. Two annual awards given: 3' and 3'3".

US EQUESTRIAN FEDERATION

LIFE, SENIOR ACTIVE AND JUNIOR ACTIVE MEMBERS SHALL BE ELIGIBLE TO PARTICIPATE IN ALL CLASSES AT REGULAR COMPETITIONS, EVENTING COMPETITIONS AT THE PRELIMINARY LEVEL OR ABOVE AND COMBINED DRIVING COMPETITIONS AT THE ADVANCED LEVEL, DRESSAGE, REINING AND VAULTING COMPETITIONS AND ENDURANCE RIDE. A NON-MEMBER MAY PARTICIPATE AS A HANDLER, RIDER, DRIVER, OWNER, LESSEE, AGENT, COACH OR TRAINER AT REGULAR COMPETITIONS, EVENTING COMPETITIONS, DRESSAGE COMPETITIONS, REINING COMPETITIONS AND COMBINED DRIVING COMPETITIONS UPON PAYMENT OF A \$30 NON-MEMBER REGISTRATION FEE. PARTICIPANTS IN THE FOLLOWING CLASSES ARE EXEMPTED FROM THE REQUIREMENTS OF THIS RULE; 1) LEADLINE; 2) EXHIBITIONS; 3) GAMES AND RACES; 4) CLASSES FOR 4-H MEMBERS; 5) WALK TROT AND ACADEMY CLASSES (Academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF INTRODUCTORY LEVEL TESTS, PAS DE DEUX AND QUADRILLE CLASSES, 7) NRHA ENDORSED REINING COMPETITIONS, 8) OPPORTUNITY CLASSES, 9) CITIZENS OF OTHER NATIONS WHO HAVE PROOF, IN ENGLISH, OF CURRENT MEMBERSHIP IN GOOD STANDING OF THEIR OWN NATIONAL FEDERATION, 10) USEA BEGINNER NOVICE DIVISION, AND 11) ASSISTANT HANDLERS IN DRESSAGE SPORT BREEDING CLASSES.

Federation Entry Agreement

By entering an Equestrian-licensed Competition and signing this entry blank as the Owner, Lessee, Trainer, Manager, Agent, Coach, Driver, Rider, Handler, Vaultor or Longeur and on behalf of myself and my principals, representatives, employees and agents, I agree that I am subject to the Bylaws and Rules of the United States Equestrian Federation (the Federation) and the local rules of the competition. I agree to be bound by the Bylaws and Rules of the Federation and of the competition. I will accept as final the decision of the Hearing Committee on any question arising under the Rules, and agree to release and hold harmless the competition, the Federation, their officials, directors and employees for any action taken under the Rules. I represent that I am eligible to enter and/or participate under the Rules, and every horse I am entering is eligible as entered. I also agree that as a condition of and in consideration of acceptance of entry, the Federation and/or the competition may use or assign photographs, videos, audios, cablecasts, or likeness of me and my horse taken during the course of the competition for the promotion, coverage or benefit of the competition, sport, or the Federation. Those likenesses shall not be used to advertise a product and they may not be used in such a way as to jeopardize amateur status. I hereby expressly and irrevocably waive and release any rights in connection with such use, including any claim to compensation, invasion of privacy, right of publicity or to misappropriation. The construction and application of Federation rules are governed by the laws of the State of New York, and any action instituted against the Federation must be filed in New York State.
